## Troop 225 Summer Camp Packing List and Information

### PERSONAL GEAR:

- Class A Uniform (including neckerchief, green pants or shorts, scout belt, Class A scout shirt updated with current rank and leadership position) – **wear to camp Troop photo will be taken**);
- Sturdy hiking boots with good ankle support;
- Tennis shoes;
- T-shirts (6 total) - yellow Troop 225 shirts – the Troop will provide each scout and adult leader w/ one free shirt at camp other scouting related shirts or blank shirts;
- Long pants or jeans and belt (1 or 2 pairs);
- Shorts (2-3 pair);
- Long sleeve shirt;
- Sweat shirt;
- Underwear (6 pair);
- Socks (6 pair socks);
- Personal hygiene items (soap, wash cloth, towel, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.);
- Personal medication (**put in day pack**);
- Shower shoes, 2 towels, and swim suit (**put in day pack or wear under uniform for check in**);
- Flashlight with extra batteries;
- Pocketknife;
- ~~Mess kit and eating utensils~~; (Will not need)
- Drinking cup w/ closed handle (hangs from hook under car port);
- Water bottle;
- Spending money and money for merit badges (\$15-\$20 plus merit badge money);
- Sleeping Pad or carpet remnant (3' X 5') to cover cot springs or wooden bunk;
- Mattress (optional. youth campers, including Senior Patrol Leaders, will not be provided with camp mattresses)
- Sleeping bag and (Summer fleece - optional);
- Notebook, writing implements;
- Envelopes, and stamps (optional for letters home);
- Neutral or Scouting related hat;
- 3 ft. whipped knot rope;
- Fishing pole (optional);
- Camera, and film (optional);
- Scout Handbook
- Merit badge books and prerequisites completed
- Totin' Chip and Firem'n Chit cards;
- Rain gear;
- Sun screen (**put in day pack**);
- Insect repellent;
- Pipestone wood (**Scout brings to check in, not packed in troop trailer**);
- Last year's Pipestone worn on uniform

## Troop 225 Summer Camp Packing List and Instructions

**Scouts must wear their Class A uniform to camp Sunday.** Also bring a day pack with your towel, swimsuit (recommend wearing under uniform), medication and sun screen. The scouts will have a swim check sometime after check-in, but before they get to their campsite.

On Sunday, you must eat lunch either on the way to camp or pack a lunch to eat at camp. Parents are responsible for getting scouts to and from camp. Parents can arrange for carpools if needed.

We will meet at St B's on Sunday 1 August at 9:00 am. All gear should be brought to St B's at this time. We will fit everything that we can into the scout trailer. What does not fit into the scout trailer will have to be taken to camp by the scout and his parents. Scouts may have to hike some of their gear to our campsite (about a mile). **Pipestone wood will not go in the trailer, scouts should bring wood at time of check-in.**

Scouts will travel with their parents (or other arranged ride) to Seven Ranges and meet between 12:00 noon and 12:30 pm. It is about a 2 hour drive (100 miles) to Seven Ranges from Westlake. Check-in at camp starts at 1:00 pm and the troop cannot check in until everyone is there.

### **What not to bring to Camp:**

- Sheath knives
- Weapons of any kind
- Personal food or drink (other than Sunday lunch)
- Cell phones
- Electronic games and PDA's
- Ipods or MP3 players
- Radios, DVD players, portable TVs
- Comic books or magazines
- Laser pointers
- Walkie-talkies

**These items will be confiscated from your son if he brings them to camp.**

Pick up on Saturday, August 7<sup>th</sup> 2010 will be no later than 11:00 am. You should plan on getting to camp by 10:00 am. The trading post closes for the last time at 11:00 am, so if you plan on getting any last minute camp souvenirs or t-shirts (or slushies), you must get to the trading post before it closes. You are expected to take your son and all his gear home at the end of camp on Saturday. We may need some help at St B's on Saturday to unload the troop gear. If you are available, please let one of the leaders know that you can help. Parents can arrange for carpools.

## SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION

The camp phone number, for emergency use, is 330-738-2085.

Parents will need to provide transportation to camp. Seven Ranges Scout Reservation is approximately 100 miles from Westlake (about 2 hours). Driving directions will be provided if needed. We must be there between 12:00 and 12:30 PM. We meet at the flag pole to the left of the administration building. The troop may not check in until we are all present. Parents should pick up their sons at 11:00 am the following Saturday. Families are welcome to remain at camp on Sunday but must depart prior to the evening meal.

Large bags will be packed in the troop trailer before departure. The trailer will be parked in front of Dempsey Hall, 9:00am on Sunday morning prior to departure for camp. Please bring the Scout's gear, with the exception of his day pack and pipestone wood, to the trailer. If it is not on the trailer, he will need to carry it back to the campsite (not recommended).

All scouts and leaders should be in full class "A" uniform at check-in on Sunday. We will take a group photo. Each scout will receive a copy. Scouts should bring swim trunks with them, or wear trunks under uniform shorts. (Do not pack away with the rest of your gear.) A swim test follows check-in.

Lunch is not served at camp on Sunday. Scouts should bring a bag lunch to eat when they arrive, or plan to eat on the way. The camp will serve dinner at approximately 6:00 PM.

Make sure any medication needed is packed in day pack and listed on the medical form. Scouting regulations dictate Scouts are responsible for self administration of their medication. Medication will be secured in an ammo box at the camp site. Adults will supervise administration of medication. Adults will remind if contacted by the parent AND provided with WRITTEN instructions with medication name, dosage and delivery time. Having this information on an index card would be helpful.

Scouts are not permitted to call home while at camp (unless it is an emergency). You have an address to write, along with an emergency phone number. It may take considerable time to reach a Scout to relay an emergency phone message depending on the time of day and program activities. Scouts should not bring cell phones. Adults should not count on cell phones working on the Reservation. Jim Augustyn's cell is 440-476-7934.

Pipestone wood should be approved before we go to camp. If not, tie it with twine and be prepared to carry what you have to the campsite. Be prepared, and do this before camp.

All adults planning on spending a night at camp should let Jim Augustyn know prior to camp. When arriving at camp, you must CHECK IN AT THE OFFICE, TURN IN YOUR MEDICAL FORM, and pay for any meals that you intend to eat at the dining hall.

Don't forget:

Last year's Pipestone, Long sleeve shirt and pants, Cap, Sunscreen, Small backpack, Personal first aid kit, Money for trading post, Wear or bring swimming gear under uniform on Sunday, Knot rope, Totin' Chip and Firem'n Chit cards
